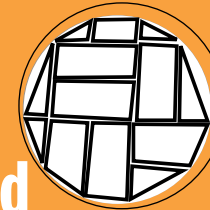

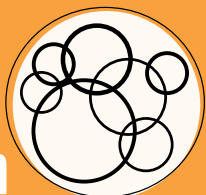

DRC

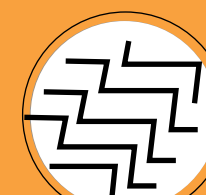


With local partners, using routine DHIS 2 data to evaluate:
