A process evaluation in **Malawi** on the Organized Network for Everyone's Health project

Zimbabwe Assistance Program in Malaria (ZAPIM)

- A mixed-methods study:
 - Evaluating ZAPIM coverage
 - Assessing malaria burden
 - Assessing capacity of National Malaria Control Program (NMCP) teams, plus hospitals and health facilities

Impact: Inform the United States Agency for International Development (USAID)/Zimbabwe's malaria elimination and NMCP strengthening

Botswana Organizational Network Analysis

- For adolescent girls and young women
 - Assess referrals for HIV testing, family planning, and post-gender-based violence care
- Findings
 - Referrals from few facilities, indicating a need to increase connections

Impact: USAID/Botswana can strengthen referral links and fill service gaps.

THOUGHT LEADERSHIP

A webinar on process tracing October 2019 attracted a record 306 participants from 57 countries.
