



# Monitoring and Evaluation Capacity Strengthening Plan

USAID Data for Impact (D4I) and National Child Development Agency (NCDA) collaborated and conducted a five-day Child Protection Management Information System (CPMIS) stakeholder workshop to gain a better understanding of Rwanda's care reform landscape, identify areas and opportunities for monitoring and evaluation (M&E) capacity strengthening, assess existing management information systems for child protection and care, and to identify priorities and requirements for integrated and reliable information management systems.

A monitoring and evaluation (M&E) Capacity Strengthening Plan was then developed to respond to key M&E gaps identified and recommendations as per the capacity areas documented in the assessment report. The activities included in the plan are aimed at improving skills, tools, and processes that would make Rwanda's National Child Development Agency (NCDA) more agile in implementing and monitoring the child protection (CP) and care M&E framework to ensure transparency and accountability to direct and indirect beneficiaries. The plan also contains practical measures to improve coordination and communication among the NCDA, Ministry for Gender and Family Promotion (MIGEPROF) and partners such as Data for Impact (D4I), UNICEF, and others who play complementary and supporting roles.

To respond to NCDA's M&E capacity strengthening needs, the gaps identified were grouped into three categories: interinstitutional, organizational, and at individual level. The main areas for capacity strengthening proposed were:

- Increase the level of interinstitutional coordination and cooperation among NCDA,

MIGEPROF, and key partners in the child protection M&E space.

- Strengthen the M&E institutional capacity of the NCDA in child protection.
- Develop M&E individual capacities of NCDA employees in child protection.

## Sustainability of the M&E Capacity Strengthening Plan

To help sustain the results of plan implementation, the following measures were planned:

- Institutionalization of forms, tools, guidelines, instructions, and processes for data collection, data analysis, data quality assurance, and data use
- Involvement of the NCDA in piloting of a longitudinal case management solution for an information system and institutionalizing the system; development and institutionalization of M&E indicators in the child protection sector with special focus on violence against children, alternative care, and case management performance
- Establishment of a collaboration mechanism among NCDA, MIGEPROF, and partners on M&E issues and facilitation of institutionalizing responsibilities for cooperation practices into normative internal processes aimed at regulating collaboration, modalities, frequency of meetings, and feedback
- Digitizing the D4I training courses, uploaded onto the NCDA e-learning platform for easy use by any new employee
